In the early years at the studio, I spent time and had regular lunches with Jon, Norm (Jon's brother), and Gladys. We all had different duties but always paused to enjoy a fine long lunch together. Gladys would start by cutting a fresh loaf of bread, slicing some turkey, Brie cheese, watercress, and putting the best sandwich together with her homemade mayonnaise. We used good dinnerware and sat at a properly set table. There were always fresh apples placed in a ceramic bowl made by her local artist friend. A homemade dessert was a must. The music was always classical and so was the conversation. We bounced around from topic to topic. I learned so much about good quality time spent with very good quality people.

What I learned most from Gladys was her patience and amazing listening skills. She never faltered. When you spoke to her, nothing else mattered. She remembered small details about your life. You knew that she cared about you and your situation. She was there for you whenever you needed her. Strangers instantly felt at ease, it was an unconditional rapport. Her sense of humor was rich. Everything from Garrison

Keillor to George Carlin made her laugh out loud.

Gladys Smith will be missed, but never forgotten. My experiences were similar to many others, but I am fortunate that she was also a part of my family. She came to most birthdays, piano recitals, funerals, weddings, baby showers, and anniversaries. I knew her family and she knew mine. How fortunate I was to know her.

#### **2017 ART ON THE HILL SHOW RULES**

Artists may submit up to 3 pieces to be judged. Only one may be marked NFS (not for sale), and if 3 entries are submitted at least one must be priced at \$250 or less. Also, with at least one judged entry, an artist may submit up to 5 portfolio pieces for sale. These will not be hung nor judged.

#### **ENTRY FEES (NON-REFUNDABLE):**

PAAG MEMBERS: \$10 entry fee for 1st entry and \$5 for each additional entry . Limit 3 entries to be judged.

5 portfolio pieces may be entered at no charge. NOTE: The ENTRY FEE FOR MEMBERS WILL BE WAIVED IF THEY BRING IN 2 OR MORE ART SHOW SPONSORS at the \$35.00 or higher levels. In order to qualify "all camera ready art work" for advertisements must be received by May 15, 2017.

**NON-MEMBERS**: \$20 entry fee for 1st entry and \$5 for each additional entry . Limit 3 entries to be judged. 5 portfolio pieces may be entered at no charge. Please note- Non-members may join PAAG for the May 1, 2017 – April 30, 2018 year by paying \$35. They then are entitled to the PAAG Member entry fees.

#### TWO-DIMENSIONAL WORK

All work must be properly framed and wired. Saw tooth hangers are not acceptable. Exposed glass on "frame-less" frames is not acceptable. Gallery wrapped canvas is acceptable provided there not any exposed staples. Artwork dimensions may not exceed 40" in any direction including frame. Two-part works will be accepted as long as the combined dimensions do not exceed 40". Note: Each piece of a two-part work counts as one entry.

#### THREE-DIMENSIONAL WORK

Work that is not freestanding must be securely attached to a base. Three-dimensional work must not exceed 2' x 2' x 2'. Sculpture stands will be provided.

#### **JURIED PIECES**

Only original artwork will be allowed and must not have been previously submitted to any PAAG show. Copies or reproductions will NOT be accepted, nor will art that is derived from other artists' work, published/printed sources or using photographs not originated by the submitting artist.

#### SALES PORTFOLIOS- (these will not be judged)

Up to 5 pieces per artist may be submitted. All prints and/or originals must be completely wrapped with clear protective covering. Artists may provide their own display rack, but the committee reserves the right to combine multiple artists in the same rack if space becomes limited. Show labels for portfolio pieces are available at <a href="www.PAAG.info/art-show/">www.PAAG.info/art-show/</a>, which must be securely attached to the back on the outside of the protective coating. Portfolio pieces must be originals, giclee prints, or signed and numbered limited edition reproductions. Photocopy prints are not permitted.

#### **GENERAL**

All artwork must be for sale or marked NFS (not for sale). No POR (price on request) will be allowed. A 30% commission will be retained on the sale of all work. Artists will receive a check for the balance shortly after the close of the show. Artists will be notified by e-mail or phone if an entry sells.

While the utmost care will be taken in handling of all artwork, neither PAAG nor The Hill School assumes responsibility for any theft or damage to the artwork.

The show committee reserves the right to reject artwork not meeting all the above rules or any work they deem unacceptable for this exhibit. If so, you will be contacted by phone or e-mail, and pickup of unacceptable artwork is Thurs June 1, from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. There is no storage available. The Pottstown Area Artists Guild and The Hill School are not responsible for any artwork not picked up.

#### ARTWORK SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 <u>.Pre-Registration</u>: Complete the <u>Entry Form</u> that is available at <u>www.PAAG.info/art-show/</u>. Make one copy for yourself to keep. <u>Mail the original Entry Form with your payment postmarked by May 15, 2017 to: "PAAG Hill Show", P.O. Box 433, Gilbertsville, PA 19525. Entry Forms are also available at www.PAAG.info.</u>
- 2. All artwork must have completed labels on the back at the time the artwork is dropped off. Labels can also be attached to the hanging wire so as not to damage backing paper. Please print clearly and include: Title, Medium, Artist's Name and Price. Labels are also available at <a href="https://www.PAAG.info/art-show/">www.PAAG.info/art-show/</a>. These labels will also be available during drop-off.
- 3. Artists may join Pottstown Area Artists Guild by paying a yearly \$35 membership fee (membership year is May 1, 2017 April 30, 2018), which can be submitted with your Entry Form. Payment of the annual dues when submitting your artwork entitles you to the member artwork entry fees.
- 4. Artwork drop off: Bring your properly labelled artwork and a copy of your entry form to The Boyer Gallery, Center for the Arts, The Hill School. Please see the website <a href="https://www.PAAG.info/art-show/">www.PAAG.info/art-show/</a> for the drop-off dates, times and directions to the Boyer Gallery.
